We would like to invite you to take part in TEDS 21. Please read this important information about what the study involves. If anything is unclear, or if you would like more information, please get in touch with the TEDS team.

What is the study about?

We would like to invite all TEDS families to participate in this new study. The aim of the study is to assess the period of development sometimes referred to as 'emerging adulthood' and it is useful for us to collect data which reflects the parental perspective in addition to the data that we are collecting from the twins themselves. This is a particularly important stage of the longitudinal TEDS project especially as the twins are going through a period of life which is currently underresearched.

What does the study involve?

You can take part in the study on your phone by downloading our new TEDS app. It can also be completed on a PC/laptop or we can send you a paper version on request. You will be asked to complete several questionnaires which will typically take around 15 minutes in total.
