Engagement study questionnaires

Note: this document includes more than one questionnaire:

- 1. The "Engagement" or "SE" questionnaire, delivered to "engaged" twin pairs in which both twins had participated in the previous web study.
- 2. The "Disengagement" or "SD" questionnaire, delivered to "disengaged" pairs in which one twin but not the other had participated in the previous web study. This questionnaire was presented in two versions:
 - a. Version 1: delivered to the "disengaged" twin in each pair
 - b. Version 2: delivered to the "engaged" twin in each pair

The two versions of the SD questionnaire have essentially the same questions but with differences in wording; hence, they have been combined into a single dataset with the same set of variables, but with a flag variable to indicate which of the twins was "engaged".

The annotations in this red font give variable names and value coding. All variables (both datasets) are double entered in the usual way, with "1" or "2" appended to the variable name for twin and cotwin respectively.

Engagement questionnaire

This is the "SE" questionnaire, for engaged twin pairs.

Each variable name is prefixed with "se", and is double-entered in the usual way with suffix "1" or "2" indicating twin and cotwin.

Disengagement questionnaire

This questionnaire was designed to be administered to twin pairs in which one twin was "disengaged" while the other was "engaged" in TEDS, according to whether or not they had participated in the previous web study (Perception). The questionnaire was presented in two forms, containing very similar questions but with different wording. Both forms are shown below.

"Disengaged" twins were asked to complete version 1, answering about themselves.

"Engaged" cotwins were asked to complete version 2, answering on behalf of their disengaged twin.

The same set of variables was used for the two versions. Flag variables (see below) indicate whether each twin was "engaged" or "disengaged", hence also indicating which version of the questionnaire they answered.

In practice, where both twins of a pair took part, a technical error led to both twins being presented with the same version of the questionnaire. Twins who took the wrong version have been eliminated from the dataset. This means that the dataset includes data only for unpaired twins.

Each variable name is prefixed with "sd", and is double-entered in the usual way with suffix "1" or "2" indicating twin and cotwin.
