THIS BOOKLET IS FOR YOU

TEDS 3 Year Parent booklet coding

This document was last updated in June 2023. Based on earlier documents of raw data and dataset coding originating in 2006 and previously updated in 2013 and 2018 for different dataset versions.

Entries in red denote variable names and values used in the <u>analysis dataset</u>. Entries in blue denote variable names and values used in the <u>cleaned raw data</u>.

Where the value coding is the same in both the raw data and the dataset, it is shown in red only. Where it differs, it is shown in both red (dataset) and blue (raw data). Any significant recoding from raw data to dataset is explained with annotations.

In the raw data variables, missing responses are given values -99 (missing) or -77 (not applicable). In the dataset, these are simply recoded to missing values.

The paper booklet had date fields on at least four of the pages, as shown. The raw dates as originally recorded had problems of missing data and anomalies. These dates have been cleaned and aggregated into a single best-estimate date, replacing the original dates in the cleaned raw data. The date fields for this date are shown at the top of the first page of questions.

As indicated in the document, where questions elicited free text responses, these have not been entered in the raw data and have not been used in the dataset. The text responses to some questions were used at the time of the study to update contact details within the TEDS admin system.

Twin-specific responses in the raw data refer to "first born" and "second born" twins, and these have separate variables as shown. In the dataset, such variable have been double-entered in the usual way, as documented elsewhere in the data dictionary. Such variables have names ending in "1" or "2", denoting twin and cotwin respectively (not denoting elder and younger twin).
