## 9 Year Parent Booklet Data Coding

Entries in red denote variable names and value coding used in the analysis dataset.
Entries in blue denote variable names and value coding used in the raw data, where this differs from the dataset.

This document was created on 27 February 2008 and last updated in July 2022.

Notes:

1. The layout and formatting of the booklet have been somewhat modified in order to accommodate annotations of variable names and value codes. However, the wording of questions and responses is unchanged. The front and back covers (including the "TEDS Contact Help" sheet on the back) were removed before data entry, so they are not shown in this document.
2. This document shows item variables, not derived variables; however, in some cases the item variables have been recoded or restructured from the raw data, and annotations show where this has been done.
3. In almost all cases, the variable names in the analysis dataset (starting with 'ip') are the same as the variable names used in the raw data. Therefore, the variable names are not duplicated for dataset and raw data, except where some change has been made.
4. In nearly all cases, the value coding in the raw data is the same as that in the dataset, in which case the coding is shown in the red font only.
5. In a few cases, the variable name or value coding in the raw data differs from the coding in the dataset, in which case the raw data variable/coding is shown in blue in addition to the dataset variable/coding shown in red.
6. In the cleaned raw data, a 'missing' response is coded as -99 and 'not applicable' is coded as -77 . However, in the analysis dataset these are all recoded to missing values.
7. The booklet contained several text-response questions in the first few pages. These have not been retained in the raw data, therefore they are not annotated in this document. Where text responses were coded into numeric values, this is explained in this blue font.
8. The parent booklet contains many twin-specific items, where the parents are asked questions about the elder and younger twins separately. In the raw data, for twin items, variable name suffixes " 1 " and " 2 " refer to the elder and younger twin respectively.
9. In the analysis dataset, all twin-specific items are double-entered with a row of data for every twin. Here, variable name suffixes " 1 " and " 2 " refer respectively to twin and cotwin, not to elder and younger twin.

- SDQ: ipsdq (with an additional prefix per/emo/con/hyp/pro for the subscale)
- CAST: ipcas
- APSD: ipaps
- Proactive aggression: ippag
- Reactive aggression: iprag
- Anxiety measures: ipanx
- ODD: ipodd
- Emotional intelligence: ipemi
- Cognitive ability: ipcoga

The variable numbering within each measure is consistent for equivalent items in the twin and teacher questionnaires at age 9 (CAST, ODD, Emotional intelligence, cognitive ability) and also for equivalent items in the same measure at other ages (SDQ, APSD, anxiety). The numbering is therefore not necessarily consecutive and does not represent the ordering as presented below.
